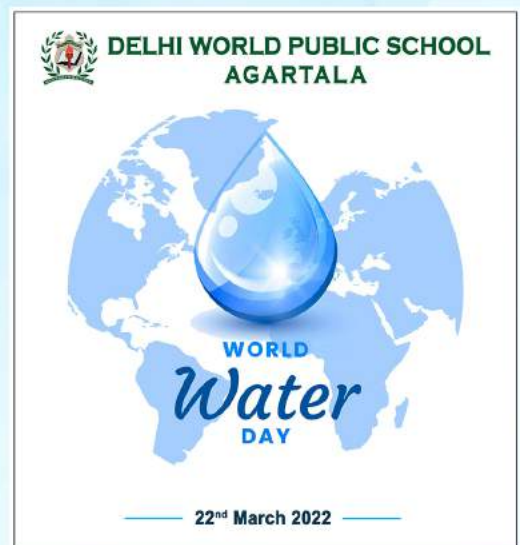
through children's activities. They honoured the sacrifices made by the heroes of our nation through brief remarks. The importance of national unity was also emphasised through singing and dancing performances.



SAVE WATER WEEK CONSERVE WATER, CONSERVE LIFE

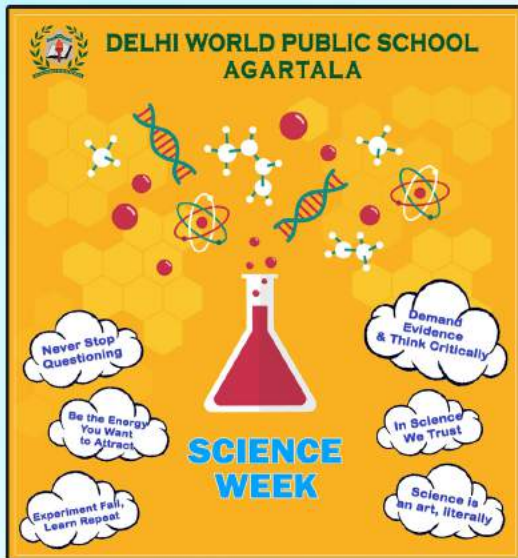
" Save water Save life."

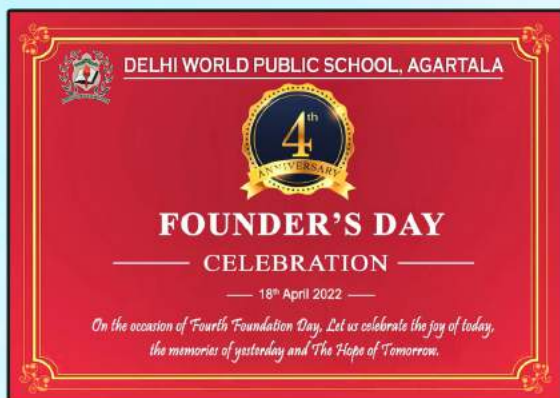

school in all aspects.

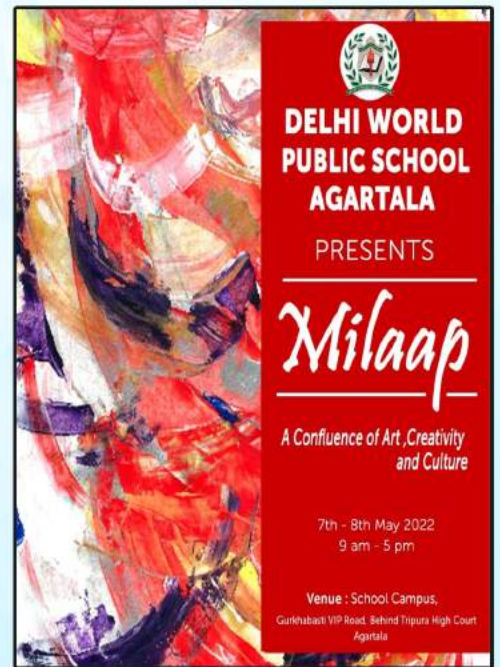


MILAAP

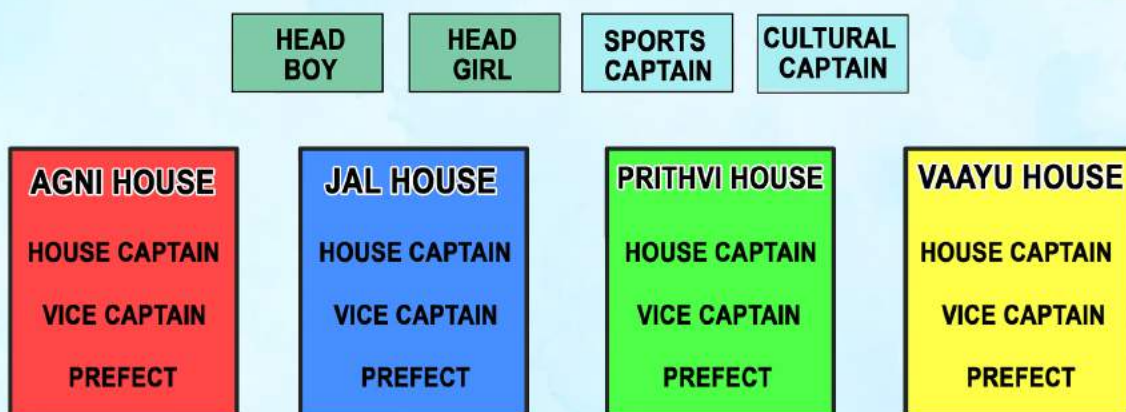
INVESTITURE CEREMONY

Raksha Bandhan

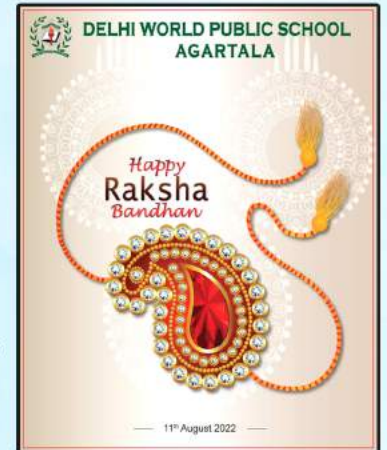
11th August 2022

of their decision. These people gave them their handmade rakhis, which made them happy and made them smile. With this in mind, we would like to extend our heartfelt thanks and best wishes to



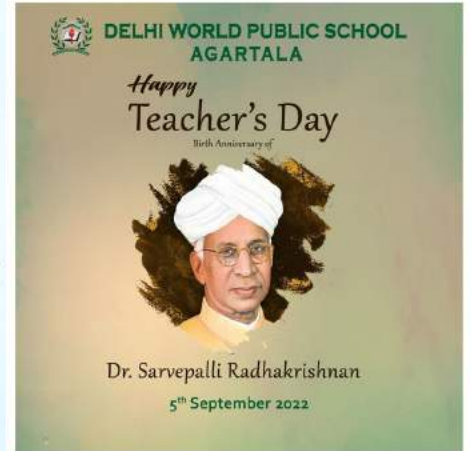
